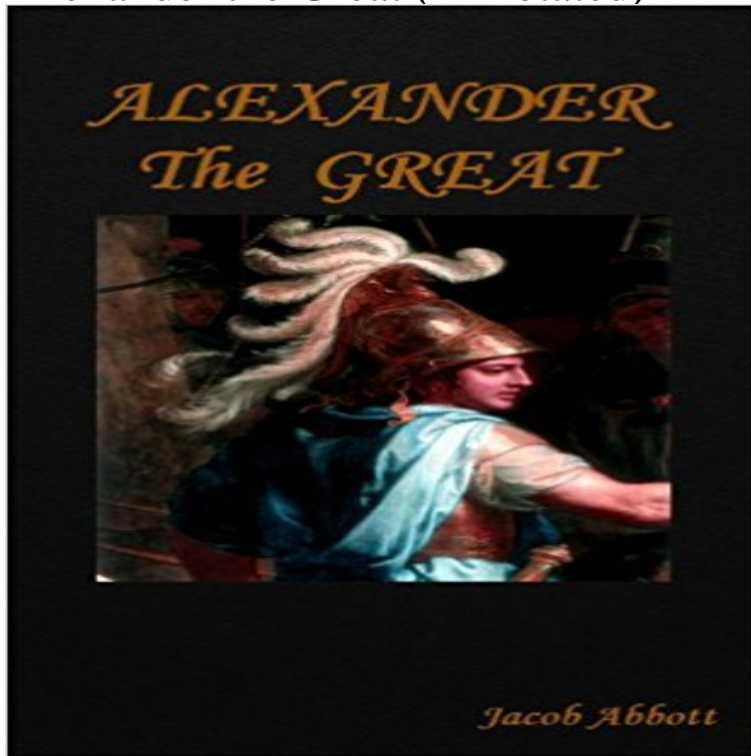


## Alexander the Great (Annotated)

But, as his fortunes rose, his character deteriorated, and he died unexpectedly at the age of 33.
