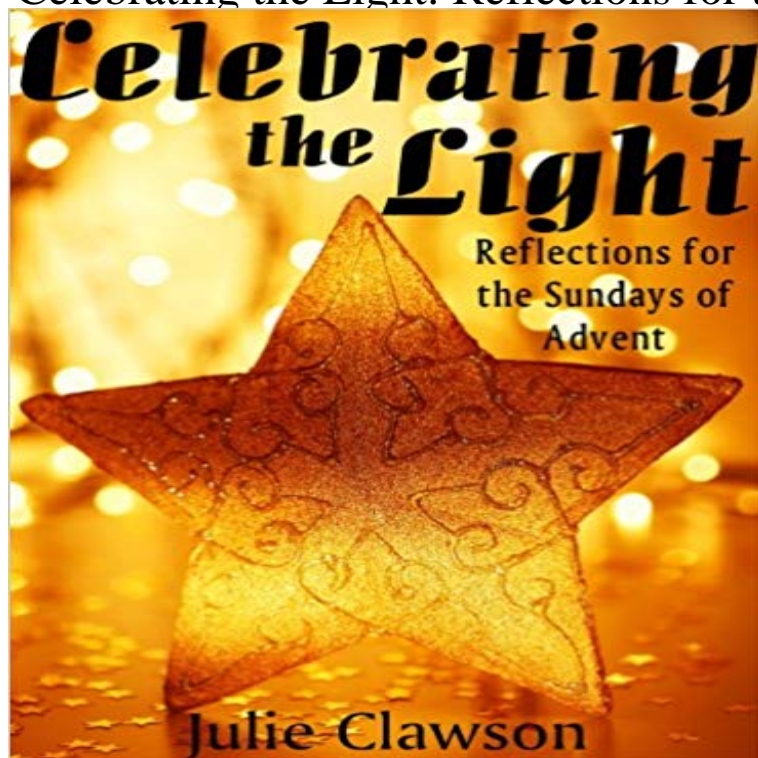


Celebrating the Light: Reflections for the Sundays of Advent

They are offered for use in private and corporate worship settings in hope that they will bless readers as they actively wait in hopeful anticipation for the Advent of our Lord.
