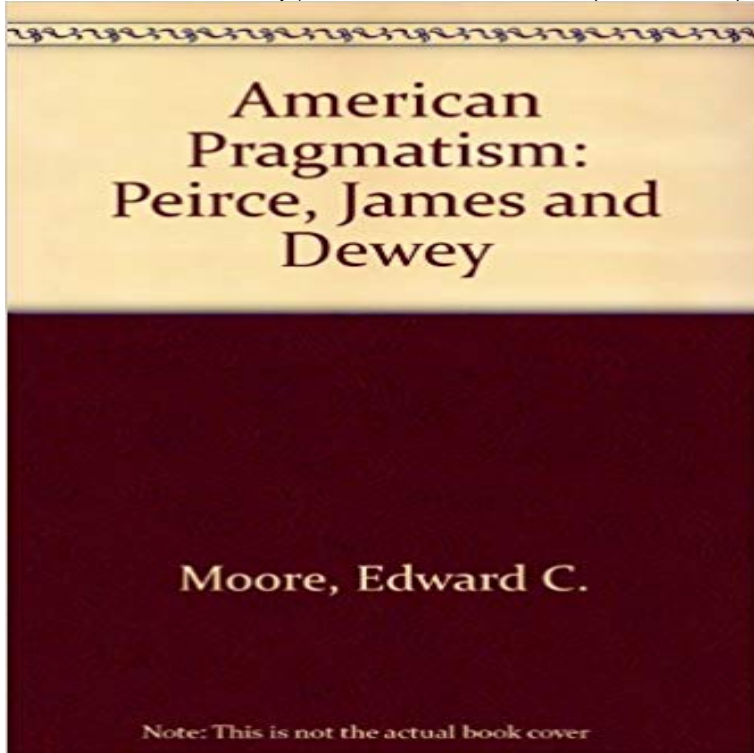


American Pragmatism: Peirce, James, and Dewey
