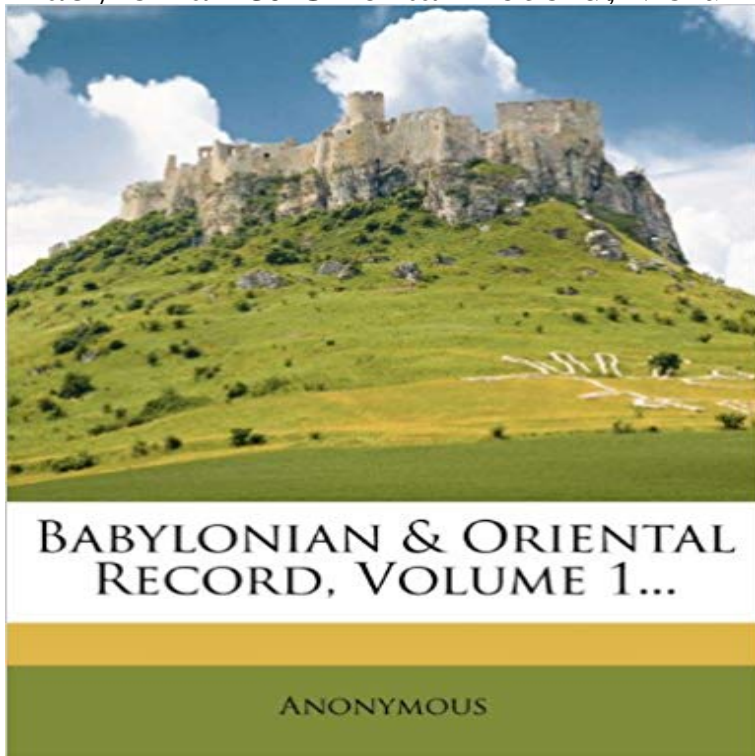


## Babylonian & Oriental Record, Volume 1...
