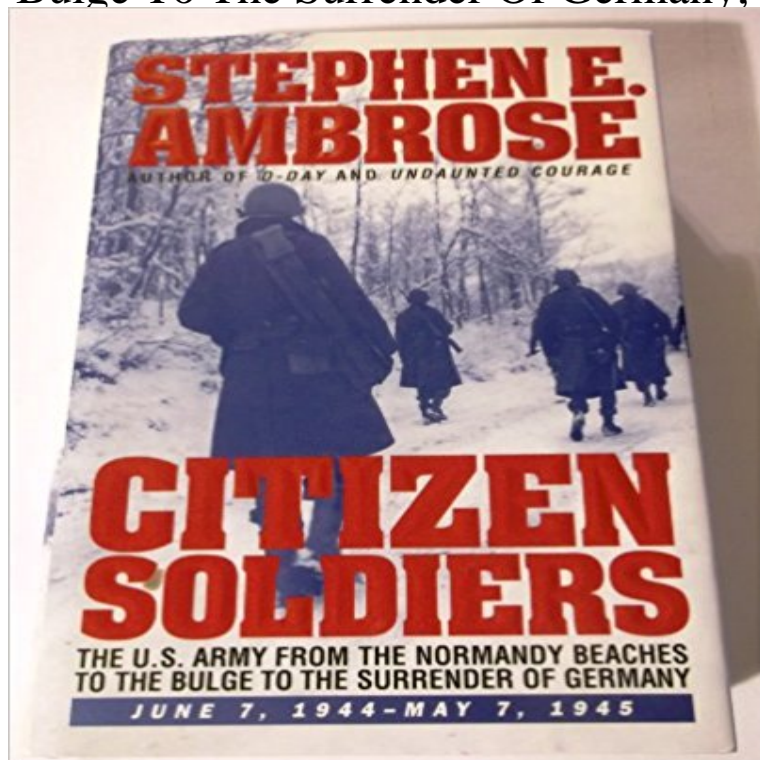


Citizen Soldiers - The U. S. Army From The Normandy Beaches To The Bulge To The Surrender Of Germany, June 7 1944 To May 7 1945
