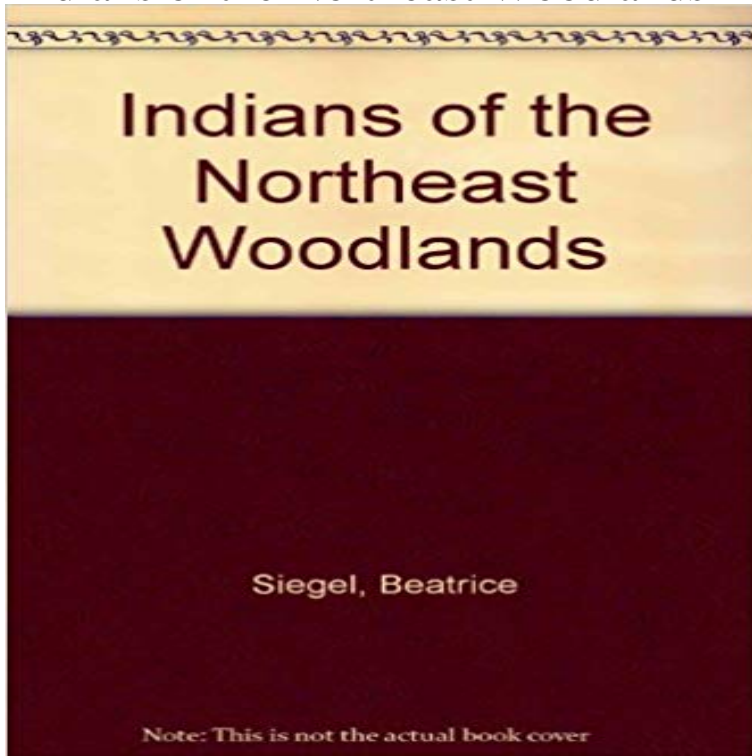


Indians of the Northeast Woodlands
