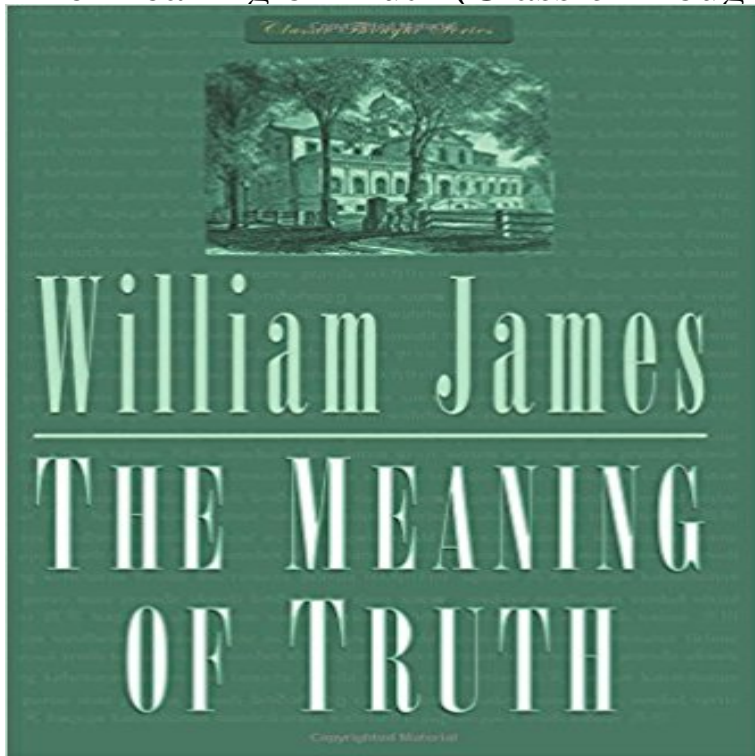


The Meaning of Truth (Classic Thought Series)

If an idea is verifiable, it can become true; if not, it cannot.
