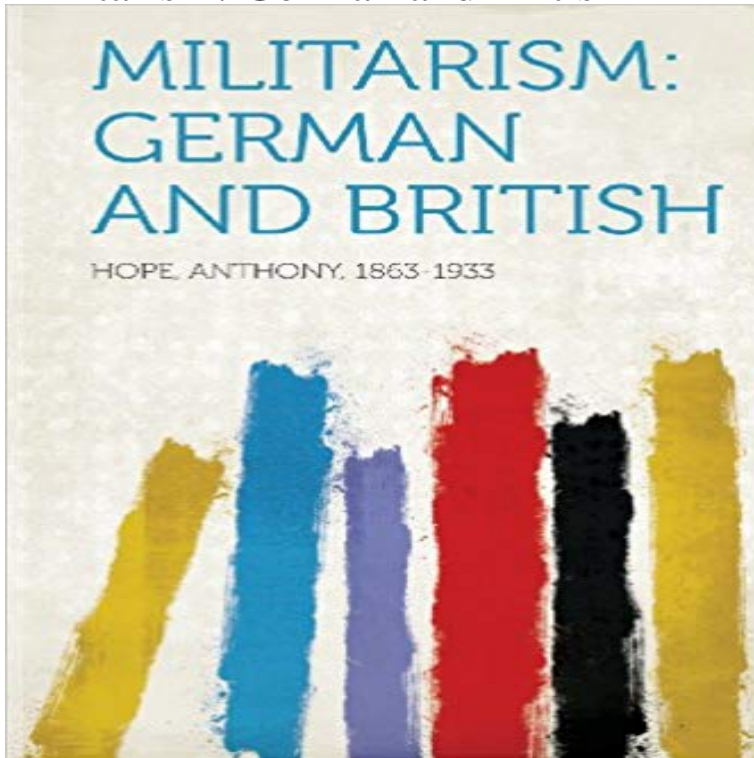


Militarism: German and British
