
## Rome 1960: The Olympics That Changed the World

There was increasing pressure to provide equal rights for blacks and women as they emerged from generations of Using the meticulous discrimination. research and sweeping narrative style that have become his trademark, Maraniss reveals the rich palate of character, competition, and meaning that gave Rome 1960 its singular essence.
