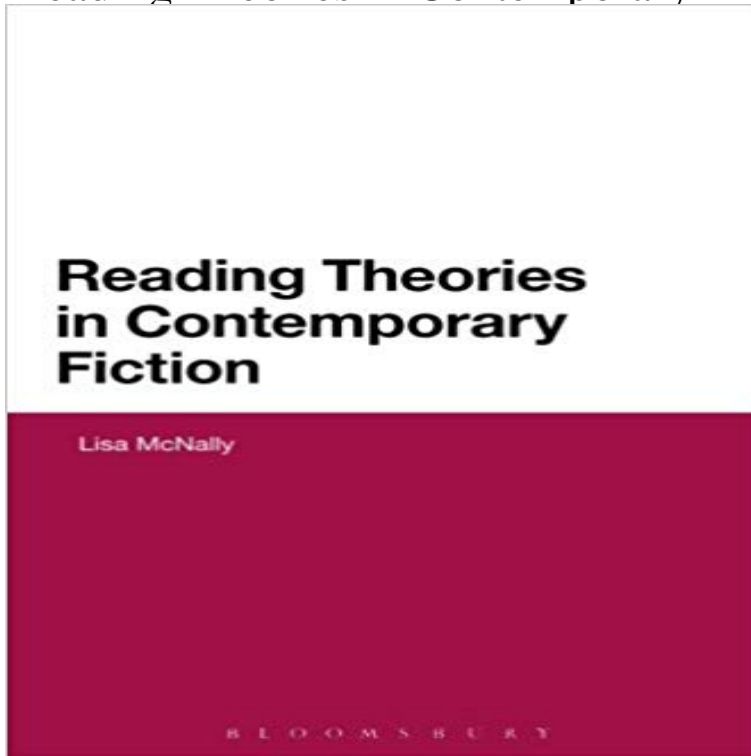


## Reading Theories in Contemporary Fiction
