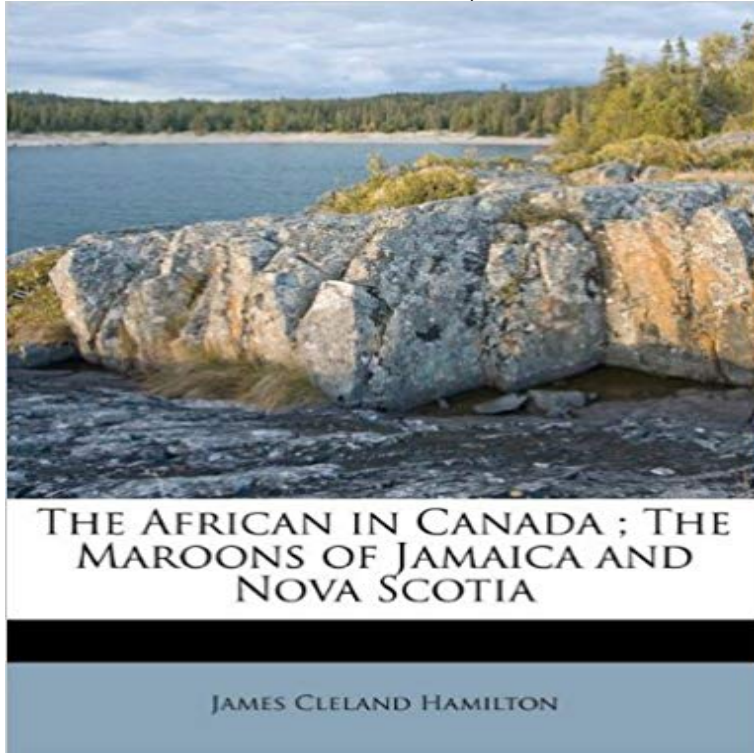


The African in Canada ; The Maroons of Jamaica and Nova Scotia
