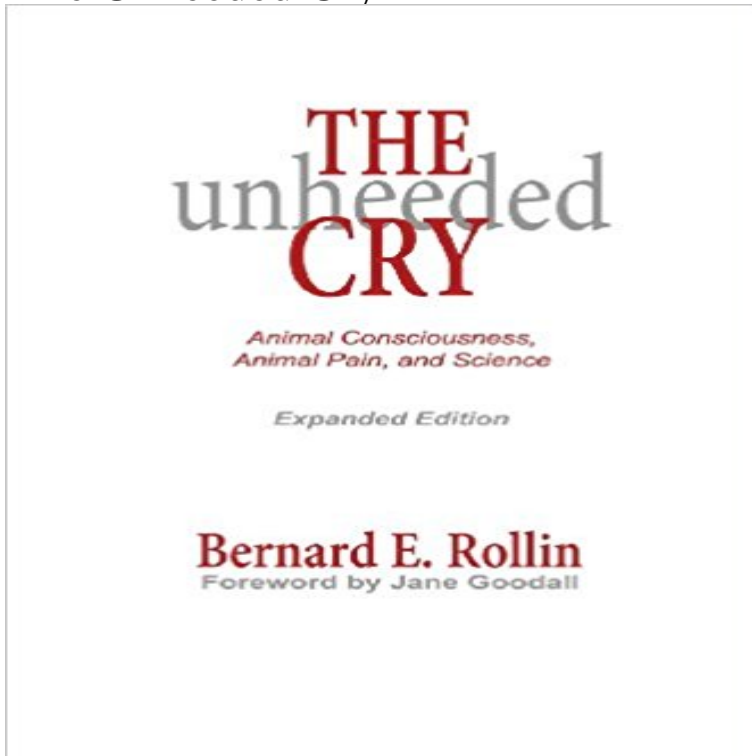


The Unheeded Cry
