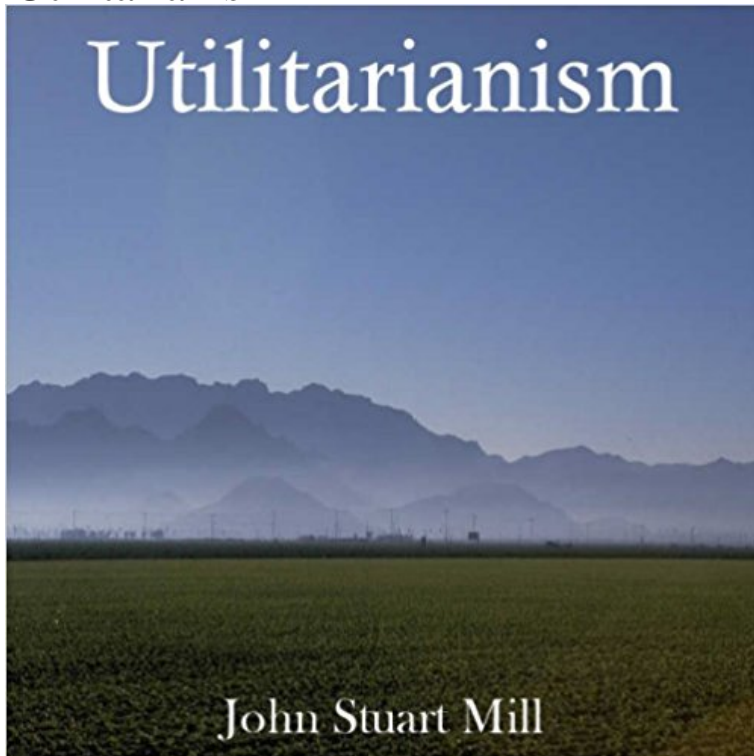


Utilitarianism
